Guangdong drafts plan for nurturing future industries

Guangdong has drafted an action plan aimed at speeding up the nurturing of seven future industries in the province including future networks, artificial general intelligence, life and health technology, low-carbon energy and advanced materials. The key objective of the plan is to form a “two cores and two corridors” spatial layout for these industries with Guangzhou and Shenzhen being the two cores and Guangzhou-Shenzhen-Hong Kong and Guangzhou-Zhuhai-Macao acting as the main axes. Guangzhou to subsidise companies in low-altitude economy

Guangzhou has announced 20 measures to promote the development of the province’s low-altitude economy. In addition to developing the infrastructure necessary for low-altitude flying routes, the measures will subsidise the development of headquarters companies in the sector along with low-altitude technology innovations. Companies operating in the low-altitude economy are eligible to receive up to RMB15 million in subsidies. ([GD Today](#))

Qianhai strengthens incubation services for Hong Kong start-ups

The Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Youth Innovation and Entrepreneur Hub, or E-Hub, has rolled out a slew of measures aimed at supporting young Hong Kong entrepreneurs. One of the measures is to provide 100,000 square metres of office space for start-ups. Qualified Hong Kong entrepreneurial teams operating out of the E-Hub will be asked to pay a service fee of just RMB1 per sqm per month to enjoy up to three years of incubation services.
